



If Measure Y passes, Oakland *WILL* hire 63 more police officers for a total of 802.

Do the math:

739 The ballot measure states: “No tax authorized by this ordinance may be collected in any year that the appropriation for staffing of sworn uniformed police officers is at a level lower than the amount necessary to maintain the number of uniformed officers employed by the City of Oakland for the fiscal year 2003-2004 (739)”

+

63 The ballot measure states: “USE OF PROCEEDS: The tax proceeds raised by this ordinance may only be used as part of the following integrated program of violence prevention and public safety intervention, in accordance with the following specific purposes: 1. Hire and Maintain at least a total of 63 police officers...”

=

802 The City attorney’s Office states in the ballot measure: “The City may collect the taxes authorized by this measure only if the City’s appropriation for sworn police officers (without including the taxes raised by this measure) is at least equal to the amount necessary to employ 739 officers.”

**The idea that Oakland would collect \$9.5 million dollars per year for additional police officers, money it can only use for hiring additional officers, and then not spend it, is not only a lie, it is simply ridiculous.
